The GYV Story

The Global Youth Village began 40 years ago with a need and a dream. A group of parents noticed that their children never met anyone from a different country or culture - something they knew was important for young people growing up in a quickly "globalizing" world. They imagined bringing together young people from around the world to live and learn alongside one another. With the leadership of J.E. Rash, founder of Legacy International, and a community of volunteers, these parents built the Global Youth Village during the particularly hot summer of 1979. That summer, GYV hosted just nine young people. Over the following four decades, with the support of dedicated alumni and numerous national and international funding agencies, the Global Youth Village has brought together more than 4,500 youth from 105 different countries.

In recent years, GYV expanded its program, partnering with the U.S. Department of State to train 400 Iraqi teens and 300 in Indonesian teens in leadership and project planning. We have also adapted our LivingSideBySide® curriculum to build tolerance in ethnically diverse public schools in Kyrgyzstan. We are bringing this curriculum to the U.S. schools nationwide.









The Global Youth Village is a program of Legacy International, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization with the mission of equipping emerging leaders to transform their values and vision into sustainable success. Legacy has special consultative status with the UN ECOSOC council and is accredited by the American Camp Association. Giving Youth A Voice

Find your own voice through our LivingSideBySide®, GYV's unique dialogue curriculum. Developed over 30 years with youth from five continents, it is the foundation for cross-cultural understanding. Through dialogue circles, teambuilding challenges, and simulations, teens learn to cooperate, embrace difference, listen and communicate with peers from vastly different backgrounds.

Tackling The Challenges of Today's Global World

Over the course of multiple day-long summits, we challenge participants to engage with and tackle issues that are significant in societies across the world today. Subject matter experts join us at the Village and virtually, leading youth through a process that results in plans to have a positive impact. 2018 themes include:

- Building bridges in divided communities
- The Refugee Crisis: How to Reach Out and Help
- · Human Trafficking: Protecting the Vulnerable
- Climate Change: Real Problem or Fanciful Hoax?

Everyone is an Artist:

Art, Music, Poetry, Dance, Acting - we all find common ground through art. We all have the power to create. Each year, we team up with the Virginia Commission of The Arts to bring artists-in-residence and guest performers to GYV. Participants enjoy drumming circles, poetry workshops, songwriting, improv classes, and dance workshops.

Enjoy and Protect Nature

Immersion in nature is part of the experience at the Global Youth Village. Students live in an untouched, natural setting, free from digital distractions and encouraged to connect and be rejuvenated by the environment around them. This continues with featured day trips, including hiking the Appalachian Trail, one North America's most beautiful wonders spanning 14 states, or canoeing the nearby James River.

Days at the Village also include special events in the evenings. Examples include cultural sharing nights, cabin nights, debate night, a talent show, and musical performances.
